REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

The Network of the Sustained Elimination of Iodine Deficiency (Iodine Network) is inviting interested consultants to submit proposals to undertake a study on the Use of Iodized Salt in Processed Foods.

Iodine Deficiency persists largely in the developing world but also to a smaller extent in developed countries in North America and Europe. While Salt Iodization programs in most countries of North America and Europe have ensured that table salt is iodized, the ever increasing consumption of industrially processed foods may be undermining iodine nutrition in these countries as the majority of processed foods are salted with non-iodized salt.

The Iodine Network is undertaking this desk study in order to better understand the described phenomenon.
